Hawaii COVID-19 Counts

As of Noon 3/27:

- 14 Statewide
- 2 on Maui
- Maui County's total confirmed cases is 16 (since 2/28/2020)
- Still no confirmed cases for Molokai and Lanai

Dramatic Decrease in Visitors and Flights

- Yesterday, March 26, Kahului Airport had only 136 passengers TOTAL
 - 81 were flight crew, 44 were residents and just 11 were visitors
- Last March, OGG averaged 6,000 passengers a day in domestic travel.
- Many flights are being canceled.
- At least 12 hotels have shut down in Maui County.

Hawaii Emergency Laulima Program

- Council passed the HELP bill today, March 27.
- Program provides \$2 million to residents who have been economically impacted by COVID-19.
- Will help residents pay for critical needs like food housing, utilities, communication and medical assistance.
- Maui Economic Opportunity will be implementing program.

NO Late Fees for Water and Sewer Bills

- The County will be waiving late fees for water bills until April 30.
- Secure drop box installed at the front entrance of the County Building
- All County bills can be paid using the drop box.
 - NO cash; Must be check.

Drive-Through Testing on MONDAY

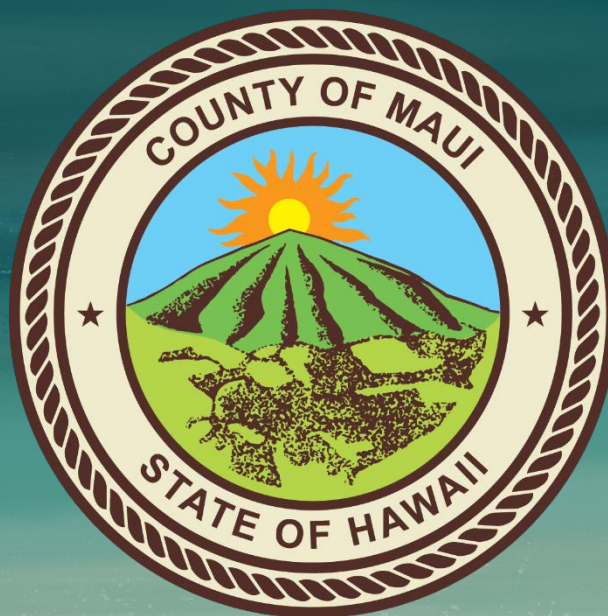
- Drive-through testing set for Monday, March 30, at War Memorial Gym parking lot.
- 162 samples were taken, earlier this week
- The drive-through testing helps prevent overloading Maui Memorial Medical Center.
- NO WALK-INS. Must call 270-7228 to make an appointment.

Mandatory Quarantine

- Passengers on the plane are given AG Form for their information
- Form asks where they're staying and cell phone number
- Information is verified and then passenger is allowed to leave airport.
- Maui Visitors and Convention Bureau reviews information and calls places of lodging to notify them that passenger must be quarantined for 14 days.
- Majority of passengers are returning Hawaii residents or catching connecting flights to the Mainland.
